Introduction/Call for Papers

Currently, the technologies of decision Support Systems (DSS) are mainly based on objective analysis of criteria. The objective approaches usually lean on statistics. In the other way, the subjective approaches are based on experiences of experts, which majorly related to experts' preferences on alternatives. However, the subjective and objective decisions often face challenges of imprecise knowledge due to inconsistency and uncertainty. Consensus among decision makers is a moderate approach to justify the correlation among experts. However, providing subjective relations among attributes could provide better projection on decision making that could assist in providing more appropriate or precise correlation and coordination among criteria . Social big data could be utilized for such purpose if its related preferences could be projected subjectively, on context based analysis.

Specific topics of interest for this special session cover various facets of Decision making under subjectivity and social big data including, but not limited to, the following:

Topics

Subjective analysis in DSS, Consensus in group DSS, Three way decision and Granular computing, Prospect theory and expert aspiration in DSS, Social analysis in decision making, subjective aggregations, Subjectiveness in rough set. Subjective normalization in DSS. Survey and future trends on Intelligent Subjectivity in Decision making process, Soft computing in Intelligent Subjectivity, preference predictions from social data, subjective attribute reductions, mental analysis in decision making, and other aspect in decision making theory and applications handling (applying) dependence or subjective relation among criteria.
